Unique Characteristics

Makes excellent ground cover for shaded or partially shaded wooded areas provided soil is moist and well-drained. Evergreen lobed leaves form dense clumps that provide interest all season long.

Plant Type:	Herbaceous perennial
Native Range:	Eastern North America
Sun:	Part shade to full shade
Water:	Medium
Soil:	Well-drained, moisture retentive soils
pH:	Acidic, < 6.8
Height:	0.75 to 1 foot
Spread:	1 to 2 feet
Wildlife:	Pollinated by insects; good for gardens prone to rabbit or deer damage
Hardiness Zones:	4 to 9
Bloom Time:	May
Bloom Color:	White or pink
Uses:	Ground cover
