Unique Characteristics

White flowers bloom in April and May with leaves in whorls of three. Best as a groundcover in shade gardens. Drought resistant.

Plant Type:	Herbaceous perennial
Native Range:	Eastern United States
Sun:	Full sun to part shade
Water:	Medium
Soil:	Medium, well-drained soil
pH:	Tolerates thin, limey soils
Height:	0.25 to 0.50 feet
Spread:	0.50 to 0.75 feet
Wildlife:	Deer and rabbit tolerant, attracts butterflies
Hardiness Zones:	4 to 8
Bloom Time:	April and May
Bloom Color:	White, star-like flowers
Uses:	Native plant gardens, groundcover in shade gardens
