Unique Characteristics

This clump-forming perennial provides late summer blooms to the garden. It prefers wet to moist soil and partial sun however its seeds require light to germinate.

Plant Type:	Herbaceous perennial
Native Range:	Eastern North America
Sun:	Full sun to part shade
Water:	Medium to wet
Soil:	Rich and humusy soil
Height:	2-3 feet
Spread:	1-1.5 feet
Wildlife:	Its flowers provide special value to bees
Hardiness Zones:	4-9
Bloom Time:	July - September
Bloom Color:	Light to dark blue
Uses:	Grows anywhere especially around streams. Very adaptable. Unpalatable to deer.
